Some of the highlights since the last newsletter:

- ⇒ 35 people lent a hand in the Neighborhood cleanup. Special thanks to the College of New Rochelle WISE club and New Rochelle High School Honor Society for their support;
- ⇒ Every year RPNA awards a scholarship to graduating high school senior who is a member of the Association. Congratulations to this year's recipients, Mari Miceli and Shane Davis for their academic and athletic success. We are very proud of them and wish them the best in their college careers.



- ⇒ We collaborated with city officials and local businesses to address key residents' concerns including the particular challenges of managing commercial businesses adjacent to residential areas, and imposing limits on proposed development that would damage the residential quality of the neighborhood.
